- Play the role of an **Immigration Consultant**
- Be my **Friendly Email Editor**

Pro Tip: Start prompts with "Act as a..." or "You are a..." to enhance output quality.

2. Magic Prompt Strategy

A formula for crafting perfect prompts.

Structure:

Role - Assign a professional role.

Goal - Specify what outcome you want.

Context - Provide background or details.

Format - Mention how the output should be presented.

Tone/Style - Choose tone, writing style, or voice.

Constraints - Add word limit, language, or rules.

Example Prompt:

"Act as a startup advisor. I am launching an indoor sports center in Canada. Give me a detailed marketing plan in table format with bullet points. Use a professional tone and limit it to 300 words."

Tell ChatGPT how to "sound."

Tones:

Specify how you want your answer delivered.

5. Bonus Tips

Elevate your prompt design skills.

Structure:

- **Be specific:** Avoid open-ended commands like “Tell me about AI.”
- **Give examples in the prompt** (e.g., “like this one: [insert example]”).
- **Use clear constraints:** “Keep it under 150 words.”
- **Add scenario context:** “Assume I am a high school teacher with no tech background.”
- **Use multiple prompt attempts** to refine results.

Term

Act as	Define ChatGPT’s role (e.g., “Act as a lawyer”)
Tone	Voice style – friendly, persuasive, etc.
Clarify	Make your request more specific
Specify	Give clear instructions (e.g., word limit, style)
Format	Output type (table, email, report)
Score	Ask ChatGPT to rate or evaluate
Reality	Remind ChatGPT to be realistic if needed
Avoid	Tell it what not to include
Refine	Ask ChatGPT to improve its own output
